We have a **HOUSING CRISIS** in Alameda County.

Affordable housing is getting harder and harder to find. It's too expensive and out of reach for many seniors, veterans, people with disabilities, low-income families and others. Many working families spend more than half of their income on housing.

A SOLUTION exists.

Alameda County elected officials, policy makers and community members have collaborated to create Measure A1, an AFFORDABLE HOUSING BOND for the November ballot.

MEASURE A1 will:

- ▶ Help people who are struggling with housing costs: seniors, veterans, people with disabilities, teachers, electricians, plumbers, EMT workers, and others who can't find affordable housing in the county.
- ▶ Help the homeless and other vulnerable populations get off of the street and into safe and stable housing with the resources they need.
- ▶ Assist first-time homebuyers in purchasing homes in their communities, letting them stay near their jobs and family in Alameda County.
- ▶ Create and preserve long-term affordable rental housing that will last for generations to come.

Taxpayer Safeguards

- ▶ All \$580 million raised by Measure A1 must stay local, dedicated only to affordable housing needs in Alameda County.
- ▶ Measure A1 includes independent annual audits to ensure funds are spent as approved by voters.
- ▶ The typical Alameda County homeowner would pay \$48-\$56 per year—less than \$5 per month—to support this critical initiative.
